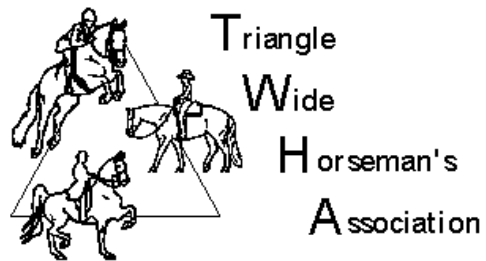

# **TWHA CREED**

## **TO ALL CONCERNED:**

### **IT IS THE INTENT OF THE TWHA THAT:**

- A. Each member exhibits his or her horse in a sportsmanlike manner.
- B. The decision of the judge is to be accepted in good faith.
- C. The judge gives his/her honest & unbiased opinion to the best of the ability for which he/she was hired.
- D. Anyone who has knowledge of any unfair tactic reports this information to an official of the TWHA as quickly as possible.
- E. Further, it is the intent of the TWHA to help create a wholesome family atmosphere in the great sport of horse showing.
- F. TWHA does not condone the illegal use of drugs, letting of blood, or the soring of horses, etc. Any horse bleeding from tack or the application of natural or artificial aids must be dismissed from the show. Any officer, board member or member of show management is authorized to enforce the rule.
- G. For situations not covered specifically by TWHA rules, NC State University Horse Judging Short Course, AHSA and AQHA rules will apply.

# **Articles of Incorporation:**

## **ARTICLE I: Title-Objective-Location**

### **Section 1. Title**

This association shall be known as the Triangle Wide Horseman's Association, Inc. (hereinafter specified as TWHA) and shall at all times be operated and conducted as a non-profit association in accordance with the laws of the State of North Carolina.

### **Section 2. Objectives**

- A. The purpose of this association shall be to unite all interested persons in the conduct and manner in which horses and riders are exhibited.
- B. To adopt, promote, encourage and enforce the show and contest rules and regulations as they appear in the current official by-laws, regulations and attachments of this association.
- C. To promote and support the shows approved by this association.
- D. To present as outlined in these by-laws an annual awards program for exhibitors and horses.

### **Section 3. Location**

The principal place of business shall be at the SOLE DISCRETION of the Board of Directors.

## **ARTICLE II: Membership**

### **Section 1.**

Membership in this association shall be open to all interested persons upon approval by the Board of Directors.

### **Section 2.**

This association shall have two (2) categories for membership: (1) Individual plan and (2) Family plan which shall be defined as at least one adult and all children 18 years & under of the registered adult. All youth shall be required to state their date of birth on their application for membership.

### **Section 3.**

Renewal membership dues from previous year members in good standing shall be due no later than March 1<sup>st</sup>. Membership applications received after this date shall be considered new applications and subject to the Board of Directors' approval.

### **Section 4.**

Memberships expire December 31<sup>st</sup> of the current year and are subject to renewal conditions as stated in Section 3 above.

### **Section 5.**

The annual dues for this association will be determined at the beginning of each year by the TWHA Board of Directors.

### **Section 6.**

Any person failing to satisfy their debt/account with TWHA for any Sanctioned functions or any other reason shall be denied membership.

### **Section 7.**

All horses registered in mid-season must be registered in writing on the proper horse registration form. NO OTHER FORM OF REGISTRATION WILL BE ACCEPTED.

### **Section 8.**

The association can or will expel any member who conducts his/herself in a manner detrimental to the function or image of the TWHA. This action would require a two-thirds majority vote of the Board of Directors.

## **ARTICLE III: Organization and Government**

The business and property of this association shall be managed and controlled by the Board of Directors and its elected officers as provided below. President, Internal Vice-President, External Vice President, Recording Secretary, Treasurer, Awards/Membership Secretary, Newsletter Editor, Immediate Past President and a Board of Directors not to exceed 13 adult directors. One or two Youth Directors may be elected annually at the discretion of the Board.

## **ARTICLE IV: Elections-Terms-Vacancies-Removals**

### **Section 1. Elections**

Members of the Board of Directors shall be elected at the annual meeting of the membership at the annual Awards Banquet. The membership shall elect nominees to specific offices for which they are nominated. To be eligible for nomination and election on the Board, those named must meet the following requirements. Election of officers will be conducted and then after results are presented to the general membership nominees for Board of Directors will be accepted at that time. Elections will be held after all nominations are received and results will be presented to the General Membership at that time.

- A. Must be a member of TWHHA in good standing.
- B. Two members of the immediate family shall not be eligible to hold the office of President and Treasurer concurrently.
- C. A member of the Board must continue as a member in good standing for the duration of his/her term.
- D. A nominee must give prior consent for his/her nomination to the nominating committee; or if nomination is made from the floor, prior consent must be given to the nominator.

### **Section 2. Term of Office**

- A. All officers and Board Members are to be elected at the annual awards banquet each year to take office the following January for a two year term. All Board members are elected at the

annual awards banquet each year to fill vacancies occurring on January 1<sup>st</sup>.

- B. All officers Directors and Youth Directors are entitled to one vote in matters concerning TWHA business. The President will vote only in case of a tie.
- C. All officers may be re-elected to the same office previously held or to any other office. The officers and other members of the board shall begin their terms as of January 1<sup>st</sup>.

### **Section 3. Vacancies**

Vacancies shall be filled as provided below:

- A. Vacancies shall be filled by the Board in the offices of President, Vice-Presidents and Treasurer. Vacancies in the offices of the directors shall be filled by the President subject to the approval of the Board.
- B. In any case, vacancies in office shall be filled for the un-expired term.

### **Section 4. Removals from Office**

When an officer is accused in writing of failure in the proper performance of his/her duties, by a member (in good standing) of this association, the Board of Directors shall conduct a hearing within seven (7) days.

An Officer or member of the Board missing more than two (2) consecutive Board meetings without just cause may be replaced by the Board of Directors (Section 3, item A above).

When, in the judgment of the Board, a secretary or treasurer is unable through disability or prolonged illness to perform the duties of his/her office, it may by simple majority vote declare the office vacated.

### **Section 5. Disciplinary Procedure**

The association can or will expel any member who conducts his/herself in a manner detrimental to the function or image of the TWHA. This action would require a two-thirds majority vote of the Board of Directors.

## **ARTICLE V: Duties of the Officers**

### **Section 1. Duties of the President**

The President shall be the Chief Executive of the association performing all duties usually pertaining to this office including specifically:

- A. He/She shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors & Membership.
- B. He/She shall see to the enforcement of the objects, provisions & purposes of this association.
- C. He/She shall, when so instructed by the board, sign and endorse all checks & warrants drawn by the Treasurer.
- D. He/She can call for a quarterly audit of the association accounts to verify that the proper amount is on deposit. He/She can also call for an annual audit of this association finances by appointing an auditing committee or firm.
- E. He/She shall be one of the three (3) authorized signatures for the association's checking account which two (2) shall be required for withdrawals.
- F. He/She shall see that each officer performs correctly & effectively his/her duties as outlined in the TWHA Handbook.
- G. He/She shall have the power to designate any special committee to study & make recommendations to the Board concerning problems encountered or projects undertaken.
- H. He/She shall appoint a committee to visit & inspect the show grounds and review the conditions of the ring and grounds when deemed necessary.
- I. He/She shall have the power to limit or extend any discussion of a topic on the approved agenda or refer topic to committee.
- J. He/She may select, subject to the approval of the Board, a parliamentarian to serve the Board and the assembly during the President's term of office.
- K. Appoint Sportsmanship Award Committee.

- L. Assign an awards committee to decide & purchase year-end awards.
- M. He/She shall call a meeting of the INCOMING officers after the November elections but prior to the JANUARY Board meeting to instruct incoming officers in the performance of their duties.

## **Section 2. Duties of the Internal & External Vice-Presidents**

### **Internal Vice-President**

In absence of the President, the Internal Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President. He/She shall be responsible for the following affairs including specifically the following:

- A. Arrange for the place selected by the Board of Directors, to hold monthly Board meetings & quarterly membership meetings.
- B. Make arrangements for Annual TWHA Horse Shows including Ribbons and Trophies,
- C. TWHA Horse Show(s) - Appointment of a chairman & committee to make all arrangements for these shows; & supervision of their work.
- D. Rules Committee & Rule Book
  - 1. Compile a list of recommended & changed rules for the Board of Directors and presents them for a vote by the December Board Meeting.
  - 2. Work with volunteers getting new rulebooks typed, sent to the printers, and distributed to the membership.
- E. He/She is responsible for typing the rulebook in preparation for printing.
- F. He/She shall be one of the three (3) authorized signatures for the association's checking account which two (2) shall be required.
- G. Compile and Review Judges List and present to the board for approval.

## **External Vice-President**

He/She shall be responsible for the following affairs including specifically the following:

- A. Nominating Committee- Form committee for the selection of nominees for the offices of President and all other officers & directors elected at the election in September. The Nominating committee shall consider only members who have served on the Board of Directors for the following officers: President, Internal & External Vice President.
- B. Horse Show Committee
  - 1. Appoint a Horse Show Committee to assist with the review of applications for show dates, assignment of dates, and the show promoters meeting.
  - 2. Arrange and conduct the annual Show Promoters Meeting in early February at which time show dates will be assigned.
  - 3. Prepare contracts for Show Promoters and Judges.
  - 4. Review applications for horse show approval and prepare show packets that include the following:
    - Acceptance Letter with Show Date(s)
    - Judges List
    - Mandatory and Optional Class List
    - Show Calendar
    - Points & Awards requirements
  - 5. Review Class lists for approval to insure that all Mandatory classes are included.
  - 6. Present to the board at each monthly meeting a list of approved shows & any judges that need to be approved by the Board of Directors.
  - 7. In the event that an approved judge cannot fulfill his/her obligations, the two Vice-Presidents shall be empowered to approve a substitute.
- C. Protest Committee - All activities, duties & responsibilities of the Protest Committee along with the power of appointment as set forth in the policies already approved by the Board of Directors.

- D. All correspondence and maintenance of records pertaining to the nominating committee, horse show committees, and protest committees.
- E. Make arrangements for Annual TWHA Annual Awards Banquet.

### **Section 3. Duties of the Recording Secretary**

He/She shall perform those duties assigned by the President, Membership & Board of Directors including specifically the following:

- A. He/She shall keep for the permanent record an account of the proceedings of all meetings of the membership and Board, which shall at all times be available to and the property of the Association. One copy of the minutes of each meeting shall be sent to the President, Internal & External Vice-Presidents and other officers requesting a copy.
- B. He/She shall prepare a written agenda for each meeting.
- C. He/She shall certify the eligible voting members at Membership & Board meetings. Voting cards shall be prepared for use during the Board meeting.
- D. He/She shall prepare a roll at the beginning of the year to be used for attendance at Board Meetings. Replacements are to be noted on this sheet if any take place during the year.
- E. He/She is responsible for any correspondence regarding the TWHA (Flower & Card Committee appointed by the President each year will handle sympathy & get well notes to be sent.) He/She will be responsible for any other administrative duties not specifically assigned to other officers.

### **Section 4. Duties of the Newsletter Editor**

- A. He/She shall prepare and mail a newsletter within no more than ten working days following each monthly Board Meeting.
- B. Collect money for advertising and forward to Treasurer
- C. Set ad rates with approval of Board of Directors.
- D. Maintain special mailing list for newsletters, (Show Promoters, and advertisers)
- E. Newsletter will be mailed to current paid members.

## **Section 5. Duties of the Treasurer**

He/She shall keep an accurate record of the TWHAs savings & check books:

- A. Write checks as directed by the President and/or Board of Directors.
  - 1. Have a receipt for each check written stating:
    - a. What the check was written for.
    - b. Date of check
    - c. Check Number
    - d. Signed by person receiving the check, if possible.
    - e. Place receipts in folder for documentation.
- B. Deposit of all Incoming Monies:
  - 1. State on each deposit slip & check book what the money is deposited for: membership dues, show approval fee, etc.
  - 2. Attach any receipts of incoming monies to deposit slip.
- C. Returned Checks
  - 1. There will be a service charge on all returned checks, i.e. insufficient funds, etc. This charge will be at the current bank charges.
  - 2. The amount of the check plus service charge shall be reimbursed by money order, certified check, cashier's check, or cash within fifteen (15) days of notification.
  - 3. It will be the responsibility of the Treasurer & Vice-Presidents to collect the amount in question.
  - 4. Any person failing to satisfy their debt/account shall be denied membership.
- D. Report Balance - Report balance of checking & savings accounts at all Board and Membership meetings.
  - 1. He/She shall balance the checkbook upon receipt of each statement. Place all statements along with cancelled checks and deposits slips in a folder.
  - 2. He/She shall record all transactions of deposits & withdrawals in a ledger
  - 3. He/She shall keep an accurate record of the TWHAs savings account(s):
    - a. Keep all statements on the savings account(s).
    - b. Balance all savings account(s) transactions.

- c. Report savings account(s) balance at Board & Membership meetings.
- d. He/She shall have the authority to transfer monies from checking account to savings and vice versa.
- 4. He/She shall have change (one, fives, tens & coins when necessary) and collect all monies at end of show for deposit for all TWHA Horse Shows, etc.
- 5. He/She shall prepare a quarterly financial report ending: March, June, September, and December.
- E. Insure that office supplies are at all TWHA Shows.
- F. Maintain Non-Profit & Tax Exempt status
- G. Maintain Insurance Policy & send to show promoters as required.
- H. Maintain SHOW program with Southern States.
- I. Maintain Horse Council Membership.

## **Section 6. Duties of the Awards/Membership Secretary**

He/She shall keep a record of all points earned under the awards program out-lined in the by-laws. This record shall at all times be available to and the property of the association.

- A. He/She shall receive all membership applications and forward membership dues to Treasurer.
- B. He/She shall keep on file all membership/horse registration forms received.
- C. He/She shall keep an alphabetical list of the members, their horses and date each horse was registered.
- D. He/She shall present to the Board of Directors at each monthly Board meetings all membership applications received for approval.
- E. All horses registered in mid-season must be registered in writing on the proper horse registration form. NO OTHER FORM OF REGISTRATION WILL BE ACCEPTED.

- F. He/She shall maintain a file of original class sheets. If the original cannot be retained, then he/she shall keep a record of the 1<sup>st</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> places for each class.
- G. He/She shall arrange for an audit of the points book in July and at the end of the show season before compiling the list of year-end awards.
- H. He/She may, at the request of any member, disclose point summaries for that exhibitor only, at any time during the show season. Members shall not request point summaries for other exhibitors. Parents may request point summaries for youth.
- I. He/She shall forward list of members to Secretary and Newsletter editor and dues to Treasurer.
- J. He/She is to provide an updated membership list to the Recording Secretary at each Board Meeting.
- K. Purchase year-end awards with the Board of Directors approval and the advice and consent of the Treasurer

### **Section 7. Duties of the Parliamentarian**

- A. He/She shall be well versed in the rules and procedures of parliamentary law.
- B. He/She shall be engaged at Board of Directors meetings and assembly meetings to render, upon request from the presiding officer of the assembly. IMPARTIAL interpretations on questions of proper procedures in transactions of the business of the assembly legally & efficiently.

## **ARTICLE VI: Duties of the Board of Directors**

The Board of Directors shall carry out the purpose & objects of the association by transacting its business & enforcing its rules & regulations.

### **Section 1. Meetings**

The Board of Directors shall hold monthly meetings at a time and place to be determined by the Internal Vice-President, but no less than four (4) membership meetings a year on a quarterly basis. Further, the Board of Directors shall meet at the call of the President or upon request of three (3) of its members. Three (3) days notice of all meetings in writing shall be given to all members and a majority of these shall constitute a quorum. Voting by mail or proxy shall not be permitted unless otherwise approved by the Board of Directors. Robert's Rules of order shall govern the conduct of all members of this association

### **Section 2. Order of Business**

1. Declare a Quorum.
2. Roll Call
3. Reading of Minutes & actions thereon
4. Reports of Officers & Board of Directors
5. Reports of Committees
6. Unfinished Business
7. New Business
8. Adjournment

### **Section 3. Board of Directors Powers**

- A. The Board of Directors shall have full power & authority to make, amend, repeal & enforce such rules, regulations, general rules, class rules, and any other headings not contrary to law or the certificate of incorporation of these by-laws as they may deem expedient concerning the conduct, management & activities of the association, the admission, suspension, & expulsion of members, removal of officers, the rules & regulations governing the procedures of such suspension & expulsion & removal. To this end, it shall have full power to bring before it any person or to inspect any pertinent records or papers to the extent that these may assist in giving all a fair & full hearing.

- B. Within the rules of the association & insofar as funds permit, the Board may affect improvements in procedures & provide additional services to the members.
- C. The Board of Directors shall authorize the Treasurer to pay bills without unnecessary delay. Bills questioned shall first be approved by the Board of Directors.
- D. The Board of Directors shall consider all suggestions for changes in by-laws of the association.
- E. The Board of Directors from time to time, may create & empower other committees, general or special.
- F. The Board of Directors may determine the salary, if any, of the secretary(s) as provided by the by-laws.
- G. A Simple majority of active Board Members shall constitute a quorum and may conduct any business necessary.

## **ARTICLE VII: Meeting of Membership**

### **Section 1**

**To be eligible to participate in all meeting, dues must have been paid at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting. The membership must meet at least quarterly.**

### **Section 2**

Members of the Board of Directors are ex-officio members of the membership but they may in no case cast more than one vote.

### **Section 3**

Voting by proxy in any form is prohibited unless approved by the Board of Directors. Only votes cast by the members present shall be counted.

### **Section 4 Order of Business**

1. Declare a Quorum
2. Roll Call
3. Reading of Minutes & actions thereon
4. Reports of Officers & Board of Directors
5. Reports of standing committees
6. Reports of Special Committees

7. Unfinished Business
8. New Business
9. Election of Officers & Directors (As Required)
10. Adjournment

### **Section 5**

In all matters governed by the vote of the members, each individual with an individual plan is entitled to one (1) vote; each membership with the family plan shall be entitled to two (2) votes. The authorized members of the family must be registered with the Recording Secretary prior to the start of any meeting.

### **Section 6.**

- A. The annual meeting of the members shall be held at such time & place as shall be fixed by the Board of Directors for the purpose of electing officers & Directors as set forth in the by-laws.
- B. Any suggestions and/or recommendations shall be considered by the Board of Directors at the next Board of Directors meeting.
- C. Notice of quarterly meetings shall be given by mailing a notice stating the time & place of such meeting to the last known address of each member in good standing. Notice of membership meetings will be posted in each newsletter.

## **ARTICLE VIII: Protests**

### **Section 1. Protest Committee Structure**

- A. A Protest Committee shall be formed at the January Board meeting as a STANDING COMMITTEE.
- B. The External Vice-President shall either chair the Protest Committee or appoint the chairman.
- C. The Protest Committee shall consist of the Chairman and four (4) members. The TWHA President shall serve as ex-officio member of the committee.

### **Section 2. Protest Procedures**

The committee will consider only protests that meet the following criteria:

- A. The protester shall immediately notify the ringmaster of intent to protest before the next class has been tied. If class in question is the last class on the stated class sheet, notice of intent must be given without undue delay.
- B. The ringmaster shall immediately notify the judge of intent to protest, and the judge may choose to recall the class.
- C. If the judge does not recall the class, then before the next class is tied, the ringmaster shall notify the show chairman or a show official, which shall immediately and appropriately identify the entry form of the class in question. This identity shall bear the DATE, AND INITIALS OR SIGNATURE of the show official, and shall remain with the class sheet until the protest is resolved.
- D. The protester shall forward a formal protest statement to the Protest Committee chairman, which shall include:
  - 1. Separate statement & fee for each alleged CLASS infraction.
  - 2. \$25.00 fee (personal checks not accepted).
  - 3. Reference to TWHA Handbook rule number.
  - 4. Description of the alleged infraction.
  - 5. Signature of the protester.
- E. The formal statement of protest shall be in the hands of the Protest Committee Chairman NO LATER than six (6) days after the date recorded on the class sheet (re: item 3 above)

### **Section 3. Protest Committee Procedure**

Upon receipt of a protest which meets the stated requirements (see Article VIII, section 2):

- A. The Protest Committee shall meet within seven (7) days to consider the protest and prepare a report to be submitted at the next scheduled Board of Directors meeting.
- B. The Protest Committee shall recommend to the Board of Directors that the protest be either upheld or denied.
- C. The Protester submitting the protest should be encouraged to attend the hearing of the protest.
- D. The protest committee shall reserve the right to executive session when making a final recommendation on a protest.
- E. A final recommendation on a protest shall require a majority vote by the Protest Committee.
- F. A final decision on a protest shall require a majority vote by the Board.

### **Section 4. General Rules**

- A. The Protest Committee shall meet only to consider a protest submitted by a TWHA member in good standing.
- B. As soon as the Protest Committed is convened to consider a protest, then the protest shall become an agenda item for the next scheduled Board of Directors meeting (whether stated on the agenda or not).
- C. The Awards Secretary shall not record any points for the protested class until the Board of Directors has reached a final decision.
- D. The \$25.00 fee shall be:
  - 1. Returned to the protester if the protest is upheld.
  - 2. Deposited in the official TWHA financial account if the protest is denied.
- E. The chairman of the Protest Committee shall notify the protester of the final decision, in writing, within three (3) days after a decision is reached by the Board of Directors.

## **AMENDMENTS**

These by-laws may be amended or repealed at any meeting by the Board of Directors by a majority affirmative vote provided there is a quorum and such amendment or proposal to repeal one or several provisions shall have been first submitted to the Board in writing at least ten (10) days before a vote for its consideration and report thereon.

## **REGISTRATION**

This Association shall provide a form for and maintain a file of registrations for all horses and horse must be shown under the recorded name at all Association approved shows throughout the year. All horses registered in mid-season must be registered in writing on the proper TWHA horse registration form. NO OTHER FORM OF REGISTRATION WILL BE ACCEPTED.

# SHOW APPROVAL

1. Promoters, clubs or individuals desiring to stage or sponsor shows recognized by the Triangle Wide Horseman's Association will submit an application for a show date (date request form) and a fee of \$50.00 to the External Vice President NO LATER THAN JANUARY 1<sup>st</sup> in order that the Horse Show committee can review applications and draw up a preliminary show calendar prior to the final assignment of dates. The Application fee shall be refunded in full if the date requested is denied by TWHA. Approvals may be accepted after Jan 1<sup>st</sup> if dates are available.
2. If such an application is satisfactory, the External Vice President will issue a statement of official approval to the proposed show. If such application is unsatisfactory, the External Vice President will so inform the show committee making application, giving the reason or particulars for disapproval within seven (7) days.
3. A show approved by the TWHA must be open to all members and any individual desiring to enter unless just case can be shown why an individual should be denied the privilege of showing.
4. Show Chairman, Co Chairman, or Show Promoter. He/She or any member of the immediate family (youth excluded) shall not exhibit a horse, or act as agent or handler of a horse in any class at a show where he/she is officiating. No horse owned by the above shall be shown by any adult. (This does not apply to TWHA or NCAHA staged shows.)
5. The last approved show must be held by the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in October.
6. The results of any approved show must be completed in their entirety. The results shall be given to the Awards/Membership Secretary of the TWHA or designated person at the end of said show along with the ORIGINAL JUDGES CARDS SIGNED BY THE JUDGE.
7. All approved shows by the TWHA must include the Mandatory classes prescribed by the TWHA. A rough draft of the Class Sheet must be submitted for approval to the External Vice President at least thirty (30) days prior to the proposed show date.

8. Any show promoter offering a High Point Award or Awards must post and publish the rules and regulations on the class sheet and at the entry booth. The rules and regulations should include the point system along with tie breaking system to be used to determine High Point awards given. This should also include classes that are Included and/or Excluded.
9. All shows shall be given a rain date eight (8) days following the original show date or another date may be assigned at the discretion of the External Vice President. In case of a show being cancelled for emergency reasons, the TWHHA Board shall provide a new date if possible.
10. Show dates shall be awarded in the following order of preference:
  1. Charitable/Non-Profit Organizations
  2. New Charitable/Non-Profit Organizations
  3. Individual Promoters that sponsored a show last year
  4. New Promoters

# JUDGES

1. Judges asked to judge a TWHA approved show must be approved by the TWHA Board of Directors. The judges list must be approved at the December Board of Directors meetings each year so the External Vice President & Secretary can advise the show promoters in January of the approved judges.
2. A judge may be approved only ONCE during any show season for TWHA sanctioned shows and cannot be used at the same show two (2) years in a row. His/Her residence should be at least fifty (50) miles from the show site or be specially approved by the Board of Directors.
3. The judge must be furnished with a copy of the TWHA Rule Book at least one week prior to show date to assure he/she is familiar with the rules and regulations of the TWHA.
4. No judge shall arrive more than thirty (30) minutes prior to show time.
5. The Judge shall not discriminate as to breed, type, class, color, age or sex. The Judge shall have the authority to place an exhibitor or horse in whatever position in a class he/she thinks merit of the exhibitor or horse justifies. His/Her decision shall be FINAL. Once a horse has been placed there shall be no changes, with the exception of a class being rerun for any reason
6. The judge shall at all times conduct his/her business with show officials ONLY and be in their company while on the show grounds. THERE SHALL BE NO FRATERNIZATION BETWEEN ANY EXHIBITOR AND THE JUDGE BEFORE AND DURING THE SHOW.
7. Neither the Judge nor members of his/her immediate family shall exhibit, act as agents, or handlers of a horse in any class, at a show at which he/she is officiating. Also if TWHA has or Sanctions any event that might last more than one consecutive day, this is considered one show. Therefore a Judge may not exhibit one day and judge the other.
8. The results of any approved show must be completed in their entirety. The results shall be given to the Awards/Membership Secretary of the TWHA or designated person at the end of said show along with the ORIGINAL JUDGES CARDS SIGNED BY THE JUDGE

## **RINGMASTER**

1. Any reputable person may act in the capacity of ringmaster. However, he/she should be familiar with the show rules, ring etiquette, be able to identify safety risks, and to intervene as necessary. He/She must have in mind that he/she has been selected to help the judge, NOT ADVISE HIM/HER. He/She shall carefully refrain from discussing, or seeming to discuss the horses or exhibitors with the judge. Ringmaster shall not take part, or seem to take part, in any of the judging.
2. He/She must be present when an exhibitor has permission to speak with the judge.
3. He/She shall not permit any undue delay of the show progress and shall have the authority to excuse un-sportsmanlike exhibitors from the ring.

## **SAFETY**

1. Youth exhibitor must be able to reach the stirrups at all times during a class with the exception of the "Leadline" class. Exhibitors may not show with feet dangling above stirrups.
2. Any horse and/or rider exhibiting unsafe or unpredictable behavior during a class will be immediately excused from the arena for the safety of themselves and other riders and/or horses without refund of show fees. Show management and/or Judge reserves the right to ascertain what qualifies as "unsafe and unpredictable behavior."

# POINTS & AWARDS

1. TWHA shall provide Year End Awards for all Mandatory classes and for those Optional classes which are held at 50% or more TWHA approved shows. To be eligible for TWHA Year End Awards the exhibitor must be a member in good standing. The horse MUST be registered with the TWHA Awards Secretary on the standard form provided. All horses registered in mid-season must be registered in writing on the proper horse registration form. NO OTHER FORM OF REGISTRATION WILL BE ACCEPTED. A minimum of 50% participation in any given class is required to be eligible for a Year End Award. Participation will be counted toward the horse unless the said class is judged on the rider, in which case participation counts on the rider. The horse or rider (if class is judged on the rider) receiving the greatest number of points in a class will receive Grand Champion Award, with the second place horse or rider receiving a Reserve Champion Award.
2. Points shall be awarded in each class as follows:
  - 1<sup>st</sup> Place - 5 points
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> Place - 4 points
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> Place - 3 points
  - 4<sup>th</sup> Place - 2 points
  - 5<sup>th</sup> Place - 1 point
3. Points are awarded to the horse in all classes except Novice Rider, Horsemanship, Showmanship, English Equitation & Western Riding all of which are awarded to the exhibitors.
4. Awards shall be presented as follows:
  - 1<sup>st</sup> Place - Award & Blue Ribbon
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> Place - Red Ribbon
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> Place - Yellow Ribbon
  - 4<sup>th</sup> Place - White Ribbon
  - 5<sup>th</sup> Place - Pink Ribbon

The awards must be specified by promoters and approved by the Board of Directors. This shall be followed regardless of the number of entries in the class. First place awards in 10 & under and Novice Rider/Horse Classes will be trophies and/or plaques.
5. Seventy-five percent (75%) pay back classes shall be as follows:

1-5 horses	1 money (100%)
6-10 horses	2 monies (60%, 40%)
11-15 horses	3 monies (50%, 30%, 20%)
16-20 horses	4 monies (40%, 30%, 20%, and 10%)
25-30 horses	5 monies (40%, 30%, 15%, 10%, and 5%)

**PERCENTAGE IS AFTER THE 25% HAS BEEN TAKEN FROM TOTAL NUMBER OF ENTRIES**

6. At the end of show season Mandatory Classes will be reviewed. A lack of participation can result in the class being removed from the Mandatory Class list and put on the Optional Class list. The Mandatory and Optional Class lists will be reviewed in January of each year and an updated list will be published by March in the Newsletter.
7. Optional Classes are not required for any TWHHA Approved Shows. However, Year End Awards will be given if fifty (50) percent of the TWHHA approved shows provided these classes. A minimum of 50% participation in any optional class is required to be eligible for yearend awards. This is based on the number of times the class was held. (Ex. If the class was held 8 times (50%of the shows), an exhibitor has to enter the class 4 times.)
8. If an Optional Class is not on the printed, mailed-out class list, but added the day of the Horse Show, this class will not receive points toward the Year End Awards.
9. The Show Chairman may hold any class not listed on the Mandatory and Optional Class Lists, but the TWHHA Awards Secretary will not tabulate points on such class.
10. If any Horse or Exhibitor is found not eligible to be in the class in question, the exhibitor/horse will be disqualified for that classes and no points will be awarded. If the exhibitor/horse is awarded a placing then the placing will be removed from the points structure and any one scoring points under that placing will be moved up and points awarded accordingly.
11. In the case of a tie regarding high point winners (High point at an individual show or year end awards) – the winner will be determined by the exhibitor/horse that has entered the highest number of classes.

## General Rules for All Awards

1. Award Winner must be a TWHA member in good standing.
2. \*Adults are 19 & Over, Youth are 18 & Under as of January 1, of the current year.
3. Points are accumulated on all mandatory & optional classes that are PRINTED on the published class sheet. If a class is not on the TWHA mandatory or optional class list, points from the class will not count toward awards. If a class is added the day of the show, points will not be counted.

[Note: For individual class awards, points are awarded to the horse & any number of riders may show the horse to earn class points as long as they are a TWHA member. In Novice Rider and Equitation/Horsemanship classes points are awarded to the rider who may ride any number of horses for individual rider class points as long as all horses are registered for points with the awards secretary. In either case, points accumulate toward "Special" year-end award on the one horse/one rider principle. Class points - but not "Special" award points - will transfer if horse is sold provided new exhibitor is a TWHA member and sale is recorded with Awards Secretary on a proper registration form.

4. Points will be awarded as follows:
  - 1<sup>st</sup> - 5 points
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> - 4 points
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> - 3 points
  - 4<sup>th</sup> - 2 points
  - 5<sup>th</sup> - 1 point
  - Shown but not placing - 0
6. You may request YOUR point standing at any time from the TWHA Awards Secretary.
7. If you show WESTERN, your points count toward WESTERN special awards.  
If you show HUNT SEAT, your points count toward HUNT SEAT special awards.  
If you show SADDLE SEAT, your points count toward SADDLE SEAT special awards.
8. In order to qualify for a year end Overall High point & Overall Reserve High Point Award – Adult or Youth – Western, Hunt Seat, or Saddle Seat - an exhibitor must accumulate a min of 50 points total.

## **High Point & Reserve Halter**

1. Points for all Mandatory and Optional Halter Classes will count towards the overall Grand & Reserve halter awards.
2. Overall High Point Halter Horse/Handler Grand & Reserve awards will be based on the Horse and Handler combination. (i.e. One Horse/One Handler)
3. Halter points do not count toward Hunt Seat, Saddle Seat, or Western overall High Point & Reserve awards.
4. Showmanship at Halter - Open, Showmanship at Halter - 18 Years & Under will be counted toward the Overall High Point Western, Hunt Seat or Saddle Seat depending on division specified on Entry form.

## **Individual Mandatory/Optional High Point Grand & Reserve Awards**

1. One Horse - One Rider for all SPECIAL YEAR-END AWARDS (SEE ABOVE).
2. Horse/rider must show at 50% of TWHA-approved shows for the current year & be a TWHA member. (Remember: Rider/Handler must be TWHA member(s) at time points are won for points to count. Example: If TWHA has 17 point shows scheduled for that year; 50% would be 8 shows.)

[Note: For individual class awards, points are awarded to the horse & any number of riders may show the horse to earn class points as long as they are a TWHA member. In Novice Rider and Equitation/Horsemanship classes points are awarded to the rider who may ride any number of horses for individual rider class points as long as all horses are registered for points with the awards secretary. In either case, points accumulate toward "Special" year-end award on the one horse/one rider principle. Class points - but not "Special" award points - will transfer if horse is sold provided new exhibitor is TWHA member and sale is recorded with Awards Secretary on proper registration form.

## **SPECIAL RULES FOR M.A "SNOOK" ALBRIGHT MEMORIAL CHALLENGE TROPHY:**

1. Rider/Handler MUST be TWHA members as above.
2. Points are accumulated ONE HORSE/ONE RIDER.
3. Points are awarded as above on 1<sup>st</sup> - 5<sup>th</sup> places: 5, 4, 3, 2, 1.

4. Points are counted from **ALL WESTERN/HUNT SEAT/SADDLESEAT/MISCELLANEOUS TWHA MANDATORY & OPTIONAL CLASSES** printed on class sheet for show (as above).
5. Same horse/rider team must win trophy 3 years in a row to retire trophy.

### **SPECIAL MEDAL PROGRAM**

Open to ANY TWHA member & registered horse. Points for medal awards (gold, silver, and bronze) will be accumulated on the exhibitor only and not the Exhibitor/Horse combination. This would allow youth that show different horses throughout the year to be able to earn enough points for a medal award. **NO 50% RESTRICTION ON PARTICIPATION** ... attendance at any number of shows earns eligibility as long as the Exhibitor earns minimum points as follows:

GOLD-75 POINTS    SILVER-50 POINTS    BRONZE-25 POINTS

### **YOUTH SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD**

1. Youth must be a TWHA member in Good Standing for current year and year previous.
2. Award is decided by a Silent Committee that is chosen at the beginning of the show season.
3. Recipient must show good manners and be willing to help with TWHA at any time during the year as well as show good sportsmanship at all TWHA functions.
4. This is a perpetual award. Recipient keeps Trophy for one year and then it is passed on to next recipient. Name of recipient is placed on a plate that remains on the award.

### **ARABIAN/ HALF ARABIAN OVERALL HIGH POINT HORSE AND RIDER AWARDS**

THESE AWARDS ARE SPONSORED AND FUNDED BY THE NORTH CAROLINA ARABIAN ASSOCIATION.

#### **RIDER AWARD**

1. Rider/Handler, and Horse **MUST** be TWHA members as above.

2. To be awarded to the Rider with the highest total number of points earned in TWHA Mandatory and Optional Classes. Points may be earned on any number or Combination of Arabian or Half-Arabian horses registered with TWHA at time points are earned
3. Rider must have shown in at least 50% of TWHA Sanction shows.
4. This a perpetual award. Recipient keeps Trophy for one year and then it is passed on to next recipient. Name of recipient is placed on a plate that remains on the award.

#### **HORSE AWARD**

1. Rider/Handler, and Horse MUST be TWHA members as above.
2. To be awarded to the Horse with the highest total number of points earned in TWHA Mandatory and Optional Classes. Points may be earned with any number or Combination of Riders who are TWHA members in good standing at time points are earned
3. Horse must have shown in at least 50% of TWHA Sanction shows.

#### **YOUTH PARTICIPATION AWARD PROGRAM**

1. To qualify for this program, you must:
2. Be a youth member of TWHA in good standing.
3. Participate in at least 50% of the current years scheduled shows.
4. Exhibitors 10 & Under must show in a total of 14 classes, and any other youth 11 & older must show in a total of 21 classes over the current show season. There is not a requirement for Leadline exhibitors.
5. Youth must complete proper form and turn it in to the show office or the awards secretary within 15 day of show date.
6. Form must be complete. Incomplete forms may not be counted.
7. Forms must include the class number and name for each show.

# GENERAL RULES FOR ALL CLASSES

1. No membership application shall be back-dated for any reason whatsoever.
2. Either the President, Vice President or Director appointed by the President shall act as a show steward at each TWHA approved show. He/She shall have the responsibility to see that TWHA rules are enforced at the show; in particular, the steward shall enforce class specifications, regulations and requirements; he or she must advise the judge, ringmaster, show chairman and exhibitors of all infractions and see that steps are taken to correct or rectify matters.
3. The show management is responsible to see that the TWHA Rules & Regulations are strictly adhered to and properly enforced to the best of their ability. Further, it is the obligation of the show management to provide a safe show environment for all exhibitors and/or participants. The show manager/management shall reserve the right to divide any class that may be deemed unsafe as a result of excessive entries into two or more sections.
4. On all Mandatory & Optional Classes the TWHA Rules will govern.
5. The exhibitor is responsible for errors on entry blank.
6. Contestants may enter or leave the ring only at the direction of the judge or ringmaster. Failure to comply will mean disqualification for that class.
7. The decision of the show judge shall be FINAL in all cases.
8. If a horse is sold during the show season, its awarded points can be transferred if the bill of sale and date is recorded with the TWHA Awards Secretary in WRITING. The new exhibitor must be a member of TWHA.
9. Competition in Youth Division shall be determined by the exhibitor's age as of JANUARY 1<sup>st</sup> of EACH YEAR. An ADULT is 19 years & over and a YOUTH is 18 years & under.

10. No entries shall be permitted in a class, and no money shall be accepted for any entry into a class after the class has been called to enter the show ring.
11. The horse or rider shall be referred to ONLY BY NUMBER until the class is officially tied.
12. SHOW ANNOUNCERS shall refrain from using the PA system for any reason other than emergencies or as directed by the judge, ringmaster or shows chairman once any class has started competition. Announcements, advertisements, etc., may be made between classes and at intermission.
13. SHOW ANNOUNCERS shall be required to give the name of the class and the number of entries only. Horse exhibitor & rider's names may be used to announce the winners.
14. Any Mandatory Class listed on a show program must be held as long as there is at least one entry.
15. Before any class can be added to the Mandatory Class List, it must first have been on the Optional Class list for at least 1 year and have been held at least 50% of the shows.
16. Any Mandatory Class that does not average 3 or more entries at the end of the show season may, at the discretion of the Board of Directors, be moved to the Optional Class List. Any Optional Class that averages 3 or more entries at the end of the show season may, at the discretion of the Board of Directors, be moved to the Mandatory Class List.
17. Tack changes are for a maximum of 5 minutes and must be requested in writing on the entry form.
18. Two minutes will be allowed for gate calls.
19. If a show is stopped due to bad weather, points will count for all classes held.
21. All Arabian Classes at TWHA shows are open to purebred and Half-Arabians.
22. No officer, director, or member may use their title or association with the TWHA in addressing in person, by phone, or any communicative means, a judge or show official when questioning the personal position or use of ones' horse in a

show. Violation of the above shall be grounds for suspension of membership under disciplinary procedures.

23. A "Go as You Please" class includes a walk and any other gait desired by the rider. These classes are open to Non-trotting horses. Consistency of gaits must be maintained in both directions of the ring.
24. Gaited horses are permitted in all GAYP classes as well as any Halter class.
24. Time out can be called for equipment failure. Length of time out will be at the discretion of the judge. Exhibitor or representative must request the time out from the Ring Master only.

# INDIVIDUAL CLASS RULES:

## HALTER

Colts & Fillies at Halter - 2 & Under  
Arabian Horse at Halter - Open  
Championship Halter - Grand & Reserve (No Entry Fee)  
English Horse at Halter - 3 & over - open  
Showmanship at Halter - Open  
Showmanship at Halter - 18 Years & Under  
Western Horse at Halter - 3 & Over – Open  
Stock Type Horse at Halter - Open

### GENERAL RULES FOR ALL HALTER CLASSES

1. For the purpose of determining eligibility for competition, the age of the horse shall be computed by the calendar year, starting on January 1, of the year foaled.
2. Horses are to be judged on conformation, substance & quality. Unsoundness is to be counted strongly against.
3. If there is a pattern it must be posted prior to the beginning of the show.

#### **Colts & Fillies at Halter - 2 & Under**

1. To be shown in Halter, or bridle, if English Type.
2. To be shown in hand at walk, jog or trot.

#### **Arabian Horse at Halter**

1. To be shown in Halter, or bridle, if English Type.
2. Horses to enter the ring at a walk, strike a trot as the approach the judge, and trot to their position on the rail.
3. They should be presented one at a time to judge, trot away from judge and return to line up, and walk a circle on loose lead in both directions, and return to their original positions on the rail for final inspection.
4. Horse can not cross enter into the Stock Type Horse at Halter.

#### **Championship Halter-Grand & Reserve (No Entry Fee)**

1. To be shown in Halter, or bridle, if English Type.

2. To be shown in hand at walk, jog or trot.
3. Open to 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Place Horses from that days Halter Classes.

### **English Horse at Halter - 3 & over - open**

1. To be shown in hand at walk and trot.
2. To be shown in English Type Halter or bridle.
3. Horse should be suitable as an English mount.

### **Showmanship at Halter - Open**

1. Western type horse to be shown in halter
2. English type horse to be shown in English halter or bridle.
3. Judged 30% on appearance of horse or pony, 10% on appearance of exhibitor, and 60% on showmanship (poise, knowledge, alertness and attitude).
4. If there is a pattern it must be posted prior to the beginning of the show.

### **Showmanship at Halter - 18 Years & Under**

1. Western type horse to be shown in halter
2. English type horse to be shown in English halter or bridle.
3. Judged 30% on appearance of horse or pony, 10% on appearance of exhibitor, and 60% on showmanship (poise, knowledge, alertness and attitude).
4. Exhibitor to be 18 years old or under.
5. If there is a pattern it must be posted prior to the beginning of the show.

### **Western Horse at Halter - 3 & Over - Open**

1. To be shown in Western Halter.
2. To be shown in hand at walk and jog.
3. Horse should be suitable as a Western mount.

### **Stock Type Horse at Halter – Open**

This includes all Quarter Horses, Paints, Appaloosas, and any horse fitting this general classification (registration papers are not required).

1. To be shown in Western OR English Halter/Bridle.
2. To be shown in hand at walk and jog or trot.
3. Horse should be suitable as a Western or Hunt Seat mount.
4. Horse can not cross enter into the Arabian Horse at Halter

# PERFORMANCE CLASSES

## GENERAL RULES FOR ALL PERFORMANCE CLASSES

1. Martingales, tie-downs, mechanical hackamores, draw reins, and gag bits are prohibited except in training classes.
2. Horses to be shown with correct, suitable English or Western attire. Formal dress with coat is not required. However, **APPROPRIATE HAT AND BOOTS OR SHOES WITH A HEEL ARE REQUIRED** in all performance classes.
3. To be eligible to show in the 75% payback Championship classes, entries must have shown in at least 1 (one) other class in that division. (i.e. Western or English)
4. Horses may be shown in all Open English classes under either Hunt Seat or Saddle Seat attire and tack.
  - A. Dressage saddles with straight smooth leather flaps may be used in Saddle Seat classes provided Saddle Seat bridle is used.
  - B. Horses may be shown in any Standard English single bit, Pelham or double bridle. Curb chains allowed on curbs, Pelhams or kimberwicks. Curb chains may be wrapped.
  - C. Whips, spurs, or crops are optional in all English Classes.
  - D. English sidesaddles are allowed in all English and open classes.
  - E. Light contact must be maintained with all reins at all gaits.
  - F. Dressage Saddle may be used in all Hunt Seat Classes provided a Hunt type bridle is used.
5. In all Western classes horses shall be shown in a Western Saddle.
  - A. Silver equipment will not count over a good working outfit. Western Sidesaddles are allowed in all Western & open classes.
  - B. In all Western classes horses 5 years and under may be shown in any class in snaffle, bosal, or curb. Horses 6 years and over may only be shown in a curb. Curb chains are permissible, but must meet the approval of the judge. No wire curbs, regardless of how padded or covered, nor

- any chain strap narrower than one-half inch will be permitted.
- C. In all Western classes reins shall be held in one hand and cannot be changed during performance. Hand to be around reins. One finger between reins is permitted with split reins. No finger between reins with the use of a romel. The romel must be carried a minimum of 15" from rein hand. Horses shown in a snaffle bit or bosal must be shown with both hands on reins.
  - D. Chaps, spurs, rope and riata are optional in all Western classes.
6. Horses may be backed in all classes (English, Western, and Open) at the Judge's discretion.
  7. Horses to be judged on performance, manners and conformation.
  8. If deemed safe by the judge, horses may be reversed at the jog or trot. Horses shall not be asked to reverse at the lope or canter.
  9. Horses to be worked both ways of the ring at all required gaits in all classes.
  10. A Novice Rider or Horse is defined as a rider or horse who has not yet received five (5) first place awards other than in Halter classes before January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current year in ANY DIVISION, AT ANY SHOW OPEN OR REGISTERED COMBINED. Any 1<sup>st</sup> place ribbons received by any one ages 10 & under will not be applied to the Novice rule. Number of 1<sup>st</sup> place ribbons will only count when the exhibitor is of the age of 11 or older.   11. If found that Novice qualifications are not met, points for that class will not count towards year end awards.

5. Only one hand may be used on reins & hand must not be changed, except around reins, one finger between reins permitted.
6. English riders or Western riders using snaffle bit or bosal may use two hands on reins as appropriate.
7. While in motion, rider's hands shall be clear of horse & saddle.
8. Spurs or romal shall not be forward of the cinch.
9. Any six of the following obstacles may be used.

- a. Opening, passing through, and closing gate. Use a gate that will not endanger horse or rider.
- b. Ride over at least four (4) logs.
- c. Rider over bridge.
- d. Ground tie horse.
- e. Carry object from one part of arena to another. Only safe and reasonable objects that can be carried on a trail ride may be used.
- f. Back horse through "L" shaped course.
- g. A Slicker.
- h. Ride over or dismount & lead horse over safe obstacle not less than 14" high or over 24" high.
- i. Remove & replace materials from a mailbox.
- j. Back through and around three markers set either in a triangle or a line.
- k. Side pass.
- l. Turn inside a square, not less than five feet (5').

THE GAIT BETWEEN OBSTACLES WILL BE AT THE DISCRETION OF THE JUDGE.

### **Ride-A-Buck**

1. No saddles allowed.
2. Riders will hold a one-dollar bill between their bodies and their horse either by sitting on it or gripping it with their legs or knees.
3. Once class starts riders may not touch the dollar bill with their hands or they will be disqualified.
4. Gaits may be called at judge's discretion and must be executed promptly by participants.
5. Judge may not call for unsafe movements.
6. Riders are eliminated for losing their dollar bill. Last rider to keep grip on his/her dollar wins.

### **Jack Benny Go As You Please**
